In line with its mandate, the LJCP publishes the **Judicial Statistics of Pakistan**, providing an in-depth analysis of the performance of the judiciary and tracking progress in addressing systemic challenges. This report, prepared under the NJPMC's directive, offers valuable insights into the trends of case filings, resolutions, and the increasing backlog in courts. For the first time, the report includes a detailed category-wise analysis, offering a comprehensive understanding of the factors contributing to judicial delays and identifying actionable steps for reforms.

The year 2023 marked significant achievements and challenges for the judiciary. Over 4.5 Million cases were filed, and more than 4.4 Million were resolved. However, the backlog has exceeded 2.1 Million cases, emphasizing the urgent need for sustained reforms. These findings underline the necessity for both immediate and long-term solutions to enhance judicial efficiency. By leveraging rigorous data collection, detailed analysis, and public legal awareness campaigns, the LJCP aims to build a judiciary that is transparent, efficient, and responsive to the needs of all citizens.

As we look ahead, collective collaboration from all stakeholders is imperative to tackle the challenges facing the justice system. Through shared efforts, we aim to strengthen the rule of law and ensure justice is delivered swiftly and fairly for all. This report not only highlights the current working status of Pakistan's judiciary but also establishes a foundational dataset for research and reforms that will shape its future. Together, we can address today's issues while building a more just and equitable society for generations to come.



## II. Overview of the Year 2023 Judicial Landscape in Pakistan

The **Judicial Statistics of Pakistan** for the year 2023 presents a comprehensive analysis of the judiciary’s performance. This report offers a chapter-wise breakdown covering key aspects such as the sanctioned and working strength of judges, human resources within the courts, and budgetary allocations. Each chapter focuses on a specific court, including the Supreme Court of Pakistan, Federal Shariat Court, and the five High Courts along with their respective district judiciaries. It provides insights into the number of cases instituted and disposed of during the year, with detailed breakdowns by bench, case category, and jurisdiction. Additionally, the report includes a ten-year trend of case pendency, and at the end of each chapter, an age-wise breakdown of pending cases categorized by the year of institution is provided, reflecting a clear view of the backlog.


This data is essential for improving the administration of justice and can be leveraged by policymakers to introduce more effective case management practices within the courts. By analyzing the trends and backlog, judicial systems can allocate resources more efficiently, streamline case processing, and enhance court productivity. Legal researchers can use these statistics to study judicial trends and identify systemic issues, while the report also provides data enabling lawmakers to propose targeted solutions to reduce pendency and improve access to justice.

As of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the Judiciary in Pakistan is grappling with a significant backlog, with the **District Judiciary** bearing the brunt, handling 82% of the total 2,256,523 pending cases. **The High Court’s** account for 15% of the caseload with 341,817 cases, while the **Supreme Court** holds 3% of the backlog, managing 56,161 cases. In stark contrast, the **Federal Shariat Court** carries less than 0.01% of the total, with just 85 cases. This breakdown underscores the immense pressure on the lower courts, highlighting the urgent need for effective case management reforms.


The overall picture reveals a troubling trend: despite the disposal of over 4.4 Million cases, Pakistan's total pendency has grown by 5%, increasing from 2.14 Million to 2.25 Million. This rise in pending cases signals that while ongoing efforts are in place, the justice system continues to struggle with a mounting backlog that requires more comprehensive solutions.



In 2023, Pakistan's courts face an uphill battle against rising case backlogs. As we dive into the details of each court’s performance, a picture of both progress and challenges emerges. This is the story of the justice system of Pakistan, one told through numbers, trends, and the stark reality of growing pendency.

The situation in the Supreme Court of Pakistan during the Year 2023 was as follows:




Being the highest judicial body, the **Supreme Court of Pakistan**, handles the most critical cases in the country. In 2023, the court witnessed a **7% increase in pending cases**, moving from **52,487** to **56,161**. While the institution of new cases is robust, at **20,827**, the disposal of **17,153** cases reveals the court's struggle to keep up with demand.


The **High Courts** across Pakistan witnessed a **4% increase** in the number of pending cases, moving from **329,918** to **341,817**. Despite disposing of **224,248** cases, a steady inflow of **236,061** new cases has kept the courts from significantly reducing their backlog.



The Lahore High Court has the highest caseload and showed a notable increase in pending cases. Both the High Court of Sindh and Peshawar High Court successfully reduced their pending cases. The High Court of Balochistan also has seen an 11% increase in backlog. The Islamabad High Court shows marginal growth in pending cases, indicating balanced performance.


This small but consistent rise indicates that while progress is being made, the High Courts remain under pressure. The backlog requires more aggressive interventions and better resource management to prevent further buildup.

The **District Judiciary** is the backbone of Pakistan’s legal system, handling the majority of cases. In 2023, this judiciary processed a staggering **4.2 Million cases**. However, despite these efforts, pending cases still rose by **5.2%**, increasing from **1.77 Million to 1.86 Million**. This rise, though modest in percentage, is significant due to the massive volume of cases. The district courts continue to face overwhelming demand, calling for innovative solutions like case management systems and Alternative Dispute Resolution methods to reduce the strain.

The District Courts of Punjab handle the bulk of the caseload but despite their efforts, pendency continues to grow due to the sheer volume. District Courts of Sindh and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa perform efficiently but still face moderate increases in pending cases. Balochistan’s District Courts saw the highest percentage increase, which could signal a need for more resources or systemic reforms. Islamabad’s District Courts are managing their caseload effectively, with a minimal increase in pendency.



This data underscores the importance of judicial reforms in Pakistan. The growth in pending cases across the Supreme Court, High Courts, and District Judiciary reveals that the system is under considerable strain. To combat the rising backlog, the courts must adopt new technologies, streamline case management, and further promote Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) methods. These steps are essential to ensuring that Pakistan's justice system can keep pace with its growing demand.

## 1. Supreme Court of Pakistan



### 1.1 Introduction:

The Supreme Court of Pakistan is the highest judicial authority in the country, entrusted with upholding the Constitution and ensuring the rule of law. It is the final appellate court for all legal matters and plays a pivotal role in maintaining a balance of power between the Legislature, Executive, and Judiciary. As the ultimate guardian of the Constitution, its rulings are binding on all courts and authorities throughout the nation, reinforcing the supremacy of law in Pakistan.

The Court exercises broad original, appellate, and review jurisdiction, covering cases of constitutional interpretation, disputes between the Federal and Provincial Governments, and issues concerning fundamental rights of public significance. These powers enable the Supreme Court to address key matters affecting the governance and legal system of the country.

Judges of the Supreme Court are appointed through a transparent, merit-based process. Nominations are made by the Judicial Commission of Pakistan, which is chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Justice and includes senior judges, the Attorney General, and representatives

from the legal community. These nominations are then confirmed by the Parliamentary Committee, ensuring that judicial appointments are based on competence and integrity. Currently, the strength of the Court is set at Sixteen judges, excluding the Chief Justice, as per the “Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1997.”

To ensure accountability within the higher judiciary, the **Supreme Judicial Council (SJC)** was established under Article 209 of the Constitution of Pakistan, 1973. The SJC comprises the Chief Justice of Pakistan, two senior judges of the Supreme Court, and two senior Chief Justices from the High Courts. It is empowered to investigate cases of misconduct or incapacity of judges. Based on its findings, the SJC can recommend the removal of a judge to the President, thereby maintaining the integrity and ethical standards of the judiciary.

The administration of the Supreme Court is managed by the Registrar, who works under the supervision of the Hon’ble Chief Justice. Supporting staff, including Additional Registrars and Deputy Registrars, assist in managing the Court’s operations, such as case preparation, scheduling, and coordination with legal practitioners. The Registry plays a crucial role in ensuring the smooth functioning of the Court by maintaining records, preparing cause lists, notifying parties, and facilitating the timely issuance of judgments.

Since its establishment in 1956 as the successor to the Federal Court, the Supreme Court had played a vital role in shaping the legal, political, and social fabric of Pakistan. Operating from its landmark building in Islamabad, the Court embodies the principles of justice, constitutionalism, and the rule of law, serving as a beacon of justice for all citizens.



- The **total number of pending cases** increased from **52487 to 56161**, reflecting a **7.00% increase** over the year. This net increase of **3674 cases** highlights the challenge of clearing the backlog despite significant disposal efforts.
- Certain categories like **Civil Petition Leave to Appeal** and **Criminal Petition Leave to Appeal** experienced notable increases, while categories like **Suo Motu Review** and **Human Rights Cases** saw reductions in the pending case load.




The Supreme Court of Pakistan has faced a consistent increase in both the institution of new cases and the backlog of pending cases over the last decade. The table below highlights the number of cases instituted, disposed of, and pending in the Supreme Court from 2014 to 2023.

- Increasing Institution of Cases:** From 2014 to 2023, the number of new cases instituted annually has remained relatively high, particularly after 2015. The peak was in 2022, with 20,580 cases filed. This trend reflects a growing demand for justice and the increasing reliance on the Supreme Court for resolving disputes.
- Disposal of Cases:** Despite significant case disposal efforts by the Court, with the highest number of disposals recorded in 2022 (**22,367 cases**), the Court has not consistently been able to match or surpass the annual institution of cases. In most years, the disposal numbers lagged behind the institution, contributing to the rise in pending cases.




The data indicates a consistent increase in the backlog of pending cases. While 2014 saw a balance of **21,713** cases, the pendency steadily grew to **56,161** cases by the end of 2023. Notably, despite the Court’s best efforts in 2022 to dispose of a significant number of cases, the overall backlog remained substantial. The backlog surge in 2023 (56,161 cases) represents a critical challenge that the judiciary continues to face.



- **Caseload Growth:** The number of cases pending at the start of each year consistently increased from 2014 to 2023. By the end of 2023, the pendency had more than doubled compared to 2014.
- **Institution vs. Disposal:** Although the Supreme Court managed to dispose of a substantial number of cases each year, particularly in 2022, the institution of cases consistently outpaced disposals, further exacerbating the pendency.
- **Backlog:** The increase in the balance of cases each year highlights the growing backlog, which needs targeted interventions to prevent further delays in the dispensation of justice.

## 2. FEDERAL SHARIAT COURT OF PAKISTAN



The Federal Shariat Court of Pakistan was established to ensure that all laws in the country conform to the Injunctions of Islam, as prescribed by the Holy Quran and the Sunnah of the Last Prophet (PBUH). The creation of the Court stems from the **Objectives Resolution** and **Article 227** of the Constitution of Pakistan, 1973 which emphasize that Pakistan's laws need to be in conformity with Islamic principles laid down in the Holy Quran and Sunna. Initially, Shariat Benches were set up in the Provincial High Courts in 1979, but the need for an independent Institution to oversee this process led to the formation of the Federal Shariat Court in 1980, under Article 203-C of the Constitution of the Pakistan 1973.

The Court is composed of up to Eight Muslim Judges, including Ulema with expertise in Islamic law. Judges, including the Chief Justice, are appointed by the President on the recommendation of the Judicial Commission of Pakistan, ensuring appointments are based on both Islamic and judicial qualifications.

The Court's jurisdiction includes the power to review any law, on its own motion or through petitions, to determine if it is repugnant to Islamic Injunctions. Additionally, it serves as the appellate court for cases under the Hudood laws, making its decisions vital in upholding the principles of Islamic law across Pakistan.




Over the past decade, the Federal Shariat Court (FSC) has made significant strides in managing to reduce its case load, as reflected in the consolidated data on pendency, institution, disposal, and case balance from 2014 to 2023.

- The number of new cases instituted each year showed some fluctuation, starting with 346 new filings in 2014. However, over the next decade, the number of cases filed each year steadily declined, with 2023 witnessing the lowest figure of just 77 new cases.
- The rate of case disposal, while fluctuating throughout the years, peaked in 2018 when the Court managed to resolve an impressive 492 cases. This significant spike in disposals during 2018 reduced the balance of cases to 375, showing a concerted effort by the Court to address the backlog that year. However, the number of cases disposed of annually has since decreased, with only 95 cases resolved in 2023.



Despite the decline in the number of new cases and the slowing rate of disposals in recent years, the FSC’s overall performance in reducing its backlog remains commendable. By the end of year 2023, the Court had successfully brought down the number of pending cases to a mere 85—compared to the 1014 at the beginning of 2014.



This decade-long data suggests a positive trend of improving case resolution at the Federal Shariat Court, although the more recent drop in disposal rates may warrant a closer look into judicial efficiency in the coming years. Nonetheless, the Court's ability to reduce its case backlog is a promising indicator of progress in the administration of justice.



### **3. Lahore High Court, Lahore**

#### **3.1 History**



The Lahore High Court has a history spanning over 150 years. By 1830, small principalities in the region handled civil and criminal disputes through arbitrators, governed by inconsistent customs. The Sadar Adalat Court in Lahore was the only judicial body at the time. In 1866, the Chief Court of Punjab was established under the Chief Court Act as the highest appellate court for civil and criminal cases, with original and supervisory jurisdiction over subordinate courts. The Punjab Courts Act of 1877, later consolidated the laws governing the Chief Court.

After Pakistan's partition, the Governor General set the Lahore High Court's strength at six permanent judges and one additional judge, effective from September 28<sup>th</sup>, 1948. In 1979, as part of separating the judiciary from the executive, 41 Extra Assistant Commissioners were placed under the court's control. On January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1981, permanent benches were established in Bahawalpur, Multan, and Rawalpindi.

Judges of the High Court are appointed by the President of Pakistan on the recommendation of the Judicial Commission under Article 175(A) of the Constitution. Candidates must have at least ten years of experience as an Advocate or relevant judicial experience, and judges serve until the age of 62 unless they resign or are removed due to incapacity or misconduct, as determined by the Supreme Judicial Council. The Lahore High Court has a total of 60 judges, including the Chief Justice.

In addition to appellate jurisdiction, the High Court has original jurisdiction to issue writs such as Habeas Corpus, Mandamus, Prohibition, Certiorari, and Quo Warranto.



- The Lahore Principal Seat started the year with **109,922 pending cases** and received **85,964 new filings**, totaling **195,886 cases**. It disposed of **76,891 cases**, leaving **118,995 pending** by year-end
- Beginning with **16,252 pending cases**, the Rawalpindi Bench saw **19,228 new filings**, resulting in a total of **35,480 cases**. After disposing of **18,596 cases**, it concluded the year with **16,884 pending cases**
- The Multan Bench had **38,800 cases** pending at the start and received **37,370 new cases**, leading to **76,170 total cases**. It disposed of **33,581 cases**, ending the year with **42,589 pending cases**
- With **14,451 pending cases** at the beginning, Bahawalpur recorded **11,556 new filings**, totaling **26,007 cases**. The bench disposed of **10,801 cases**, finishing the year with **15,206 pending cases**



At the beginning of 2023, the judiciary was confronted with **179,425 pending cases**. Over the year, it received an impressive **154,118 new cases**, bringing the total caseload to **333,543 cases**. Throughout the year, the judiciary successfully disposed of **139,869 cases**, yet an aggregate balance of **193,674 pending cases** remained by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

This data reveals a **7.9% increase** in the overall backlog compared to the start of the year, underscoring persistent challenges in managing case backlogs. The judiciary's ongoing efforts to enhance efficiency are crucial in addressing these trends and improving overall case resolution outcomes.





- The institution of new cases saw a peak in 2017 with 159,320 cases, while the lowest was in 2020 with 124,352 cases, likely reflecting a dip due to external factors such as the pandemic.
- Case disposals showed a high in 2015 with 162,435 cases resolved, but decreased in the following years, hitting a low of 118,175 in 2020. Although disposals rebounded in 2021 and 2022, reaching 157,085 in 2022, the increasing balance of pending cases highlights the growing backlog.



Over the past decade, the backlog of pending cases has shown a clear upward trend, reflecting the increasing challenge of case resolution in the judiciary. In 2014, the pending cases stood at 164,683, but despite some fluctuations, the backlog steadily rose, reaching 193,674 by 2023.



Notably, even in years where case disposals increased, such as in 2015 and 2022, the balance of unresolved cases continued to grow. This consistent rise in pending cases points to a widening gap between the institution and disposal rates, highlighting the need for reforms to enhance the efficiency of case management and reduce delays in the judicial process.



- Criminal Cases:** Out of 39,556 total pending cases, a significant portion (13,535) was instituted in 2023, indicating that recent filings account for a large share of the backlog. Older cases from prior to 2014 contribute minimally, with only 1,223 pending from that period.

- **Civil Cases:** The backlog of civil cases stands at 56,401, with notable numbers spread across the years. However, cases from 2023 (9,734) form a large chunk of the pendency, while older cases are gradually being disposed, but still remain in substantial numbers.
- **Writ Cases:** The largest category by far, writ cases total 97,717 pending cases. There is a significant number of writ cases from 2023 (28,653), suggesting a surge in recent years. However, writ cases dating back several years remain a persistent issue, particularly those from 2021 and 2022, which together account for over 29,000 cases.

The data shows a substantial and increasing backlog across all case types, particularly for recent years. While older cases (pre-2015) make up a smaller proportion of the total pendency, the majority of unresolved cases stem from the past three to four years. This highlights a growing trend of cases accumulating faster than they are being resolved, especially in writ and criminal cases. Effective case management and expedited resolution strategies are critical to addressing this backlog, with particular attention needed for the influx of cases in recent years.

### 3.9 Budget Allocation for the Financial Year 2022-23

- The budget allocation for the Lahore High Court in the Fiscal Year 2022-23 amounted to **Rs. 6,416.02 million**. This includes **Rs. 5,092.55 million** for the Principal Seat in Lahore, along with funding for the Rawalpindi, Multan, and Bahawalpur Benches.
- The district judiciary, consisting of Sessions and Civil Courts, was allocated an additional **Rs. 21,449.01 Million**.
- The total budget allocation of **Rs. 27,865.03 million** was made for the judicial system under the Lahore High Court's jurisdiction.

### 3.10 Sanctioned and Working Strength of Officers and Officials in the Lahore High Court (31<sup>st</sup> December 2023)

As of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the Lahore High Court had a sanctioned human resource strength of 3,307 personnel. Out of these, 2,639 male and 138 female employees are currently working, leaving 530 positions vacant. The staff covers a wide range of roles, from high-ranking officers like the Registrar and Additional Registrars to technical and support positions.

The data on human resource strength in the Lahore High Court as of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023, shows a significant gender disparity, with 2,639 male employees and only 138 female employees actively working. This indicates that women constitute a small percentage of the workforce, representing just over 5% of the total working strength. Gender inclusion remains limited, particularly in senior roles, highlighting the need for greater diversity and balanced representation across various positions.

### 3.11 Working and Sanctioned Strength Judicial Officers in Punjab Province as on 31-12-2023

#### 3.11.1 Designation-Wise Working and Sanctioned Strength of Judicial Officers in Punjab Province

The data reveals a total of 2,364 judicial positions across various levels, with a significant vacancy rate, particularly among District and Sessions Judges and Civil Judges/Judicial Magistrates.

- While the sanctioned positions for **District and Sessions Judges (BS-21)** are fully filled (100%) **reflecting a 0% vacancy rate**.
- There is a concerning shortfall in the ranks of **Additional District and Sessions Judges (B-20)**, where only 518 out of 606 positions are occupied, **reflecting a vacancy rate of approximately 15%**.
- The **Senior Civil Judges (B-19)** category, with all the sanctioned posts filled, reflecting a **0% vacancy rate**.
- The most pronounced deficit is seen among **Civil Judges/Judicial Magistrates/Family Judges (BS-17 and BS-18)**, where 686 positions remain vacant out of a total of 1,613, indicating a **vacancy rate of approximately 42.5%**.

This critical shortage highlights the urgent need for recruitment and retention efforts to address the judicial backlog and enhance the efficiency of the justice system. Overall, the analysis underscores a pressing need for strategic planning in judicial appointments to ensure a balanced and effective judiciary.

#### 3.11.2 Working and Sanctioned Strength of Judicial Officers in Punjab Province

The table provides Consolidated district-wise sanctioned and working strength of judicial officers in Punjab as of December 31, 2023. The total number of sanctioned positions across all districts is 2,009, with 1,542 male officers and 221 female officers currently working, reflecting limited gender inclusion at **12.5%** for females. Notably, some districts show significant vacancies, particularly Lahore, where 31 positions remain unfilled.

In the context of the Punjab District Judiciary, Ex-cadre positions refer to posts that are not part of the regular or permanent cadre of judicial officers. These positions are typically temporary or created for specific roles, often outside the mainstream judicial duties. Ex-cadre officers may be appointed to handle special courts, administrative tasks, special projects, or other non-judicial functions that support the judiciary.

The Ex-cadre positions are also limited, with a small representation of 12 male and 3 female officers across various districts. Overall, while the distribution of judicial officers is generally balanced across districts, there is a clear gender gap and room for improvement in filling vacant positions and increasing diversity.

In total, the district courts in Punjab handled **3,113,163** new cases throughout 2023, while disposing of **3,086,960** cases. This means that the courts achieved a **99.2% disposal rate** compared to new institutions, a strong performance by any measure. However, despite this high disposal rate, the total pendency rose from **1,312,379** at the beginning of the year to **1,379,355** by the year's close, marking a **5.1%** increase. While this is a modest rise in comparison to the volume of cases handled, it highlights the courts' struggle to fully contain the ever-growing influx of new cases.



- The Civil Courts started the year with a backlog of **1,167,553** cases. During 2023, an additional **2,206,406** cases were filed, representing an **88.9%** increase in the total caseload. Despite this overwhelming influx, the courts managed to dispose of **2,196,580** cases, which accounts for **99.6%** of the new cases filed during the year. By the end of 2023, the backlog had risen slightly to **1,210,338**, an increase of **3.6%** from the start of the year. This reflects the courts' effectiveness in handling nearly all of the newly instituted cases while also working through older ones, though the slight rise in pendency suggests that the rate of institution outpaced disposal marginally.
- The Sessions Courts began the year with **144,826** pending cases. Over the course of the year, **906,757** new cases were filed, reflecting an **over six fold increase** in their caseload. The Sessions Courts disposed of **890,380** cases in 2023, covering **98.2%** of the new cases instituted. Nevertheless, the pendency increased by **24,191** cases, reaching **169,017** at the year's end, indicating a **16.7%** rise in unresolved cases. The Sessions Courts have shown high efficiency in their case disposal, but the backlog growth demonstrates the significant pressure from the increasing number of filings.

The statistical data underscores that while the courts have been able to dispose of nearly as many cases as they have received, the pendency figures demonstrate the challenge of keeping pace with the steady rise in new case filings. For instance, the Civil Courts disposed of **approximately 99.6%** of new cases, yet the pendency rose slightly due to the substantial volume of new institutions. Similarly, the Sessions Courts disposed of **98.2%** of new cases, but also saw an increase in backlog by **16.7%**.



#### 4 High Court of Sindh



The High Court of Sindh traces its origins back to the establishment of Sindh as a separate Province on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1937, following the enactment of Part III of the Government of India Act, 1935. The court, initially known as the Court of the Judicial Commissioner of Sindh, was governed by the Sindh Courts Act, 1926, which mirrored the Letters Patent of the Bombay High Court. To meet the immediate judicial needs of the Province, this Act was brought into operation in 1940, raising the status of the court to the Chief Court of Sindh. The structure of the court evolved over time, beginning with a Judicial Commissioner and three Additional Judicial Commissioners in 1907, which expanded further in 1937. When the High Court of West Pakistan was established, the number of judges allocated to the Karachi Bench was increased, and after the separation of Sindh and Baluchistan High Courts, the Sindh High Court retained 12 judges, while Baluchistan had 3. Today, the total sanctioned strength of judges in the Sindh High Court stands at 40.

The appointment of judges to the High Court of Sindh is governed by Article 175(A) of the Constitution of Pakistan 1973, as amended by the 18<sup>th</sup> Constitutional Amendment. A Judicial Commission, chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Justice of Pakistan, recommends eligible candidates for appointment as judges, whose names are forwarded to a Parliamentary Committee for approval. The final nominations are then sent to the Prime Minister, who submits them to the President of Pakistan for appointment. To qualify for the position of a High Court Judge, an individual must be a citizen of Pakistan and must have either served as an advocate of the High Court for at least ten years or held a judicial office for ten years, with a minimum of three years as a District Judge. High Court judges serve until the age of sixty-two unless they resign earlier or are removed according to constitutional procedures.

The High Court of Sindh exercises a broad range of judicial powers, including appellate jurisdiction over civil and criminal cases. It also has original jurisdiction to issue Writs such as Habeas Corpus, Mandamus, Prohibition, Certiorari, and Quo Warranto. The principal seat of the High Court is in Karachi, with a Bench at Sukkur and Circuit Courts at Hyderabad and Larkana. Additionally, more benches may be established as determined by the Governor, on the advice of the Cabinet, in consultation with the Chief Justice of the High Court. The court's pecuniary jurisdiction has been gradually increased to ease its caseload, particularly in Karachi, where the original pecuniary jurisdiction of District Courts was limited to 25,000 Rupees. This limit has been raised multiple times, with the latest enhancement to 15 Million Rupees under the Sindh Civil Courts (Amendment) Act, 2010.

- At the Principal Seat in Karachi, which handles the majority of cases, there was a **slight reduction of 0.4%** in the number of pending cases. The court started the year with **65,407** pending cases, received **19,176** new cases, and disposed of **19,536** cases, concluding the year with a balance of **65,146** cases. The disposal rate at Karachi exceeded the number of new institutions by **1.88%**, indicating efficient case management.
- The Bench at Sukkur saw a **9.91% decrease** in pending cases by year-end, having started with **5,517** cases and reduced them to **4,970**. During the year, the court received **5,098** new cases and disposed of **5,632**, resulting in a disposal rate that surpassed new institutions by **10.47%**. This shows that Sukkur managed to handle its caseload effectively, clearing a significant number of pending cases.
- The Circuit Court, Hyderabad performed exceptionally well in 2023, achieving an **11.89% decrease** in pending cases. The court began the year with **11,538** pending cases, received **5,771** new cases, and disposed of **7,145** cases. By the end of the year, the pending cases had reduced to **10,164**. Notably, Hyderabad had the highest disposal-to-institution ratio, disposing of **23.84% more cases** than were instituted, making it the best-performing court in terms of handling its caseload.
- In contrast, the Circuit Court, Larkana experienced a **2.98% increase** in pending cases, one of the few courts where the backlog grew. The court started with **3,319** pending cases, received **3,284** new cases, and disposed of **3,185**, leaving a balance of **3,418** cases. This slight increase suggests that the Larkana court may need additional support or resources to reduce the backlog and improve efficiency in case disposals.
- The Circuit Court, Mirpurkhas, which had no pending cases at the beginning of the year, saw **243 cases pending** by the end of 2023. Over the course of the year, the court received **586** new cases but was only able to dispose of **343**, cases achieving a disposal rate of **58.53%** compared to new institutions. This relatively low disposal rate indicates a need for focused attention to improve the clearance of cases in Mirpurkhas.



In 2023, the judicial seats and benches in Karachi and its surrounding regions demonstrated overall efficiency in case management, with notable successes in case disposals. The year began with a total of **85,781** pending cases across the Principal Seat in Karachi and its four benches. Throughout the year, **33,915** new cases were instituted, while the courts successfully disposed of **35,841** cases, resulting in a final balance of **83,941** cases by year-end. This reflects a **2.15% decrease** in the total number of pending cases compared to the start of the year, underscoring a positive trend in judicial processing.

In summary, the courts collectively disposed of **5.69% more cases** than the new cases instituted in 2023. While this reflects positive overall performance, individual court performance varied. The Circuit Court in Hyderabad and the Bench at Sukkur demonstrated strong efficiency in managing their caseloads, while Larkana and Mirpurkhas faced challenges in either maintaining or reducing their backlogs.

This narrative highlights the courts' commitment to reducing the backlog, while also identifying areas that may require additional focus and resources to maintain this positive momentum in the coming years.



- **Criminal Jurisdiction:** 5,119 cases from that Year 2023 remained unresolved. The total pendency across all years in criminal jurisdiction is 11,448 cases, with a sharp increase in recent years, highlighting a growing backlog in criminal matters.

- **Civil Jurisdiction:** Civil cases show the largest backlog, with 6,574 cases still pending from 2023 alone. The total pendency in civil matters stands at 41,494 cases, with a particularly high number of unresolved cases from 2018 onwards, reflecting a significant accumulation of civil disputes awaiting resolution.

• **Writ Jurisdiction:** The Writ Jurisdiction is experiencing a steep rise in pendency, with **7,299 cases** from 2023 still unresolved. The total number of pending writ cases is **39,299**, with a marked increase from 2020 onwards, showing a growing strain on the system's capacity to handle writ petitions.

• Across all jurisdictions, there are **90,715 pending cases**, with the largest surge occurring in 2023, where **18,992 cases** remain unresolved. The rise in pending cases reflects an urgent need for judicial reforms to address the growing backlog.



#### 4.8 Consolidated Pendency, Institution, Disposal and Balance of Cases in the High Court of Sindh during the Last 10 Years.



It highlights the fluctuations in new cases filed (institution), cases resolved (disposal), and the resultant balance of cases still pending at the end of each year. The data provides insight into how the judicial backlog has evolved over the decade, reflecting both periods of increased case accumulation and recent efforts to improve case disposal rates and manage the growing pendency.

- The number of newly instituted cases fluctuated throughout the decade, peaking in 2017 with **42,762** cases and reaching its lowest in 2020 during the pandemic, with **28,346** cases. After 2020, case filings recovered but did not return to pre-2020 levels, with **33,915** new cases in 2023.
- The disposal rates have varied but generally tracked close to the number of new cases instituted each year. The highest disposal occurred in **2023**, where **35,841** cases were resolved, surpassing the number of cases instituted in that year. This marks a notable achievement in case management compared to previous years, particularly 2014-2017, when disposal often lagged behind institution.



Despite fluctuations in institution and disposal rates, the overall balance of pending cases has been inconsistent. Notably, between 2014 and 2017, pending cases steadily increased, reaching **93,039** in 2017. However, since 2018, efforts to reduce the backlog appear to have had some effect, with the balance of pending cases reducing to **83,941** by the end of 2023, marking a slight improvement from the peak in 2017.



Over the last decade, the High Court has seen fluctuating trends in the institution and disposal of cases, with a consistent increase in the number of pending cases from 2014 to 2017, reaching a peak of **93,039** in 2017. However, from 2018 onwards, the balance of pending cases started to gradually decline, with **83,941** cases remaining unresolved by the end of 2023. This improvement is due to disposal rates starting to surpass or nearly match the rate of new case institution in recent years, particularly in 2023, where disposals exceeded new cases filed. Despite this progress, the backlog remains significant, highlighting the need for sustained efforts to manage case flow and improve judicial efficiency.

## 4.9 Budget Allocation for Financial Year 2023-24

### 4.9.1 High Court

For the High Court of Sindh, a budget of 4.40 Billion Rupees has been set aside, distributed across its Principal Seat and various branch and bench registries. The Principal Seat at Karachi receives the largest share, with 3.27 Billion Rupees. The Bench at Sukkur is allocated 298.74 million rupees, while the Circuit Court Hyderabad receives 402.52 Million Rupees. Additionally, the Circuit Court Larkana and Circuit Court Mirpurkhas are allocated 305.28 Million Rupees and 124.09 Million Rupees, respectively.

### 4.9.2 District Judiciary

The District Judiciary has been granted a total of 10.74 billion rupees. This amount is further divided between the various types of courts within the district system. Sessions Courts receive 3.97 billion rupees, while Civil Courts are allocated 6.14 billion rupees, representing the largest share within the District Judiciary. Family Courts are allocated 221.36 million rupees, and Consumer Protection Courts are assigned 407.61 million rupees.

#### 4.10 Sanctioned and Working Strength of Officer and Officials in the High Court of Sindh (31<sup>st</sup> December 2023)

The following section provides a detailed overview of the human resource allocation for various posts within the organization. The data presented highlights the sanctioned strength, working strength (segregated by gender), and the number of vacancies for each position.

As of the current fiscal year, the total sanctioned strength stands at **3,667** employees, of which **3,416** positions are filled, comprising **1,479 males** and **516 females**. This leaves **251 positions** currently vacant, affecting key administrative, technical, and judicial roles.

Key positions such as Registrar, Member Inspection Teams, Director IT, and Deputy Registrars are fully staffed, ensuring the continuity of critical functions. However, certain positions like Additional MITs, Director Library and Research, and several technical roles remain vacant, which could potentially hinder the effective functioning of specific departments, especially in terms of research and technology management. Addressing these vacancies promptly would help enhance overall operational efficiency, particularly in areas that support judicial processes and modernization efforts.

It is also important to note that administrative and support staff, including Private Secretaries, Court Associates, and Office Attendants, form a substantial portion of the workforce. These roles are crucial for the smooth day-to-day operations of the judiciary, handling essential tasks such as documentation, communication, and logistical support. A well-balanced workforce in these positions ensures that judicial operations continue uninterrupted and that the needs of both the judiciary and the public are met efficiently.

The staffing data highlights areas where focused recruitment is needed, especially in research and technology-related roles. By addressing these gaps, the judiciary can ensure that all departments are functioning efficiently, thus enabling a more streamlined delivery of justice and smoother internal operations.

#### 4.11 District-wise Sanctioned and Working Strength of Judicial Officers in the Sindh Province as on 31-12-2023

##### 4.11.1 Designation-Wise Strength

The data outlines the sanctioned, working, Ex-cadre, and vacant positions for judicial officers in Sindh. The total sanctioned strength stands at **661** positions.

- **District and Sessions Judges:** Of the 28 sanctioned positions, 27 male and 1 female judges are serving, with no vacancies. Additionally, 41 male and 17 female Ex-cadre judges provide support, fully covering the required capacity.
- **Additional District and Sessions Judges:** Out of 150 sanctioned posts, 122 male and 10 female judges are working, leaving 18 vacancies. These gaps are significant given the critical role this category plays in handling high caseloads.
- **Senior Civil Judges:** With 142 sanctioned positions, 118 male and 17 female judges are in place, while 7 posts remain vacant. Filling these vacancies will further strengthen civil case management.
- **Civil Judges/Judicial Magistrates/Family Judges (BS-17/18):** The largest group, with 341 sanctioned positions, has 276 male and 49 female judges, with 16 positions vacant. This group handles the bulk of cases, making the vacancies particularly pressing.

The working strength of Judicial Officers is 620, supplemented by 41 male and 17 female Ex-cadre officers. 41 vacancies remain, primarily among Additional District and Sessions Judges and Civil Judges, which are vital for case disposal and backlog reduction. Addressing these vacancies and enhancing gender balance will improve the judiciary's efficiency and responsiveness in Sindh.

Female representation remains limited, particularly in senior positions, pointing to a need for increased recruitment efforts in this regard.

#### 4.13 Category-wise Pendency, Institution, Disposal and Balance of cases in the Sindh province of during the year 2023

The 2023 data for Sindh's district judiciary reveals a commendable effort in managing the high volume of cases, with a disposal rate closely aligned with the influx of new cases. However, a slight increase in the overall backlog—primarily in criminal cases—highlights the need for enhanced reforms and resource allocation to effectively manage the growing caseload.

- Criminal cases saw a rise in pendency from 59,104 at the start of the year to 65,328 at the end, despite the disposal of 284,393 cases out of 291,100 instituted during the year, reflecting a 10.5% increase in the backlog.
- Civil cases fared slightly better, starting with 64,380 pending cases and ending with 66,595, with 94,606 new cases instituted and 92,766 disposed of, marking only a 3.4% increase in backlog.



In total, the year began with 123,484 pending cases, with 385,706 new cases instituted and 377,159 cases disposed of. By the end of 2023, the total pending caseload had risen to 131,923, marking an overall increase of 6.8%. The data indicates that although the judiciary performed efficiently in disposing of a large number of cases—nearly matching the number of new cases filed—the small gap between institution and disposal led to a gradual increase in the backlog, particularly in criminal cases.

This data underscores that while the judiciary worked efficiently, there is a need for continuous improvements in case management to reduce the growing backlog, especially in criminal cases.



## 5 Peshawar High Court



Following the dissolution of the “One Unit” system, Pakistan established four Provinces, each with its own High Court. The Peshawar High Court was formed for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, with its principal seat at Peshawar. The legal framework governing civil courts in the region dates back to the Punjab Courts Act of 1884, with further consolidation through the N.W.F.P. Regulation No. 1 of 1931. The Establishment of West Pakistan Act, 1955, temporarily merged Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (then N.W.F.P.) with other regions under the West Pakistan High Court, with principal seats in Lahore and benches in Karachi and Peshawar.

The Peshawar High Court today has a sanctioned strength of 20 judges, including the Chief Justice. These judges are appointed by the President of Pakistan in accordance with Article 175-A of the Constitution. The Court's principal seat is in Peshawar, with additional benches in Abbottabad, Dera Ismail Khan, Mingora, and Bannu.

Under the Constitution, the Peshawar High Court exercises appellate jurisdiction over judgments, decisions, decrees, and sentences passed by Civil and Criminal Courts. It also has Original Jurisdiction to issue Writs, including Habeas Corpus, Mandamus, Prohibition, Certiorari, and Quo Warranto, thus ensuring the enforcement of fundamental rights and legal compliance in its territorial jurisdiction.

In 2023, the overall performance of the Principal Seat and various benches under the jurisdiction showed mixed results.

- The **Principal Seat in Peshawar** demonstrated effective case management by significantly reducing its backlog. Starting the year with **21,063** pending cases, **16,784** new cases were instituted, and **18,708** were disposed of, leaving a balance of **19,139** cases by the end of the year. This reflects a notable disposal with a reduction of **1,924** pending cases.
- The **Abbottabad Bench**, however, experienced an increase in pending cases. Starting with **8,389** cases, **4,115** new cases were instituted, and **3,362** were disposed of, resulting in a year-end balance of **9,142**. The disposal rate stood at **28.31%**, with an overall increase of **753** pending cases, indicating room for improvement in handling its caseload.
- The **D.I. Khan Bench** achieved the highest disposal rate with **55.35%**, with **2,382** cases disposed of out of the total **4,408** cases handled during the year. This resulted in a reduction of **480** pending cases, reducing the year-end balance to **2,026** cases, reflecting a positive trend in case resolution.
- At the **Mingora Bench/Chitral**, the performance was stable with a disposal rate. Out of the **11,883** cases processed, **4,692** were disposed of, and the year ended with a slight increase in pending cases, from **7,152** to **7,191**, indicating a manageable workload.
- The **Bannu Bench** showed a modest performance. Out of **6,276** cases handled, **2,300** were disposed of, but the pending cases increased by **430**, closing the year with **3,976** cases. This highlights the need for enhanced case management strategies.

- The **Circuit Court in Chitral** processed a limited number of cases. With only 29 new cases and 31 disposals, leaving a year-end balance of 478 cases, just 2 cases lower than the beginning of the year.



Overall, the total number of cases pending at the start of 2023 across all benches was **43,136**, and by the year’s end, this figure had decreased to **41,952**. A total of **30,291** new cases were instituted, and **31,475** cases were disposed of across all the benches. While some benches managed to reduce their backlog effectively, others saw an increase in pending cases, highlighting areas that may benefit from further attention in the coming year.





- Over the past ten years, the number of newly instituted cases has generally increased, with some fluctuations. Peaks in institution rates, particularly in years like 2019 and 2023, suggest periods of heightened case filings, which contributed to the growing caseload.
- Although the judiciary has consistently worked to dispose of cases each year, disposal rates have not consistently matched the rate of new institutions. This imbalance has led to a gradual increase in the backlog over the decade, with a slight improvement in 2023 as disposals outpaced institutions for the first time in several years.



Over the last ten years, the data paints a comprehensive picture of the judiciary's case management dynamics, highlighting both achievements and challenges. Starting in 2014 with a pending caseload of **26,977** cases, the system has faced a continuous increase in newly instituted cases, reaching peak volumes in years like 2019 and 2023. Despite fluctuations, the

average annual institution of **26,080** cases reflects a steady flow of cases into the system, driven by a range of factors from legal reforms to societal trends.



Parallel to this influx, the judiciary has worked consistently to increase disposal rates, averaging around **24,583** cases disposed of each year. However, disposals have not consistently matched the rising rate of new institutions, leading to an expanding backlog. The balance of pending cases reached **41,952** by the end of 2023, marking a significant increase over the decade.

This growing backlog indicates that the efforts to resolve cases have struggled to keep pace with demand. However, a hopeful development emerged in 2023, when disposals exceeded institutions for the first time in years, resulting in a slight reduction in the pending balance. This positive shift suggests that recent improvements in case management may be beginning to take effect.

In sum, the last ten years underscore the judiciary’s commitment to handling an increasing caseload, yet also highlight the structural need to align disposal capacity more closely with incoming cases. Moving forward, a sustained focus on enhancing disposal rates and implementing efficiency measures will be crucial to reversing the backlog trend and achieving a more balanced judicial system.

For the **Peshawar High Court** and its benches, the 2023 budget allocation was specifically assigned to maintain and support the operations at the Principal Seat in Peshawar and its benches in Abbottabad, Dera Ismail Khan, and Mingora. This allocation aimed at covering expenses for judicial staff, operational costs, administrative functions and any essential management or upgrades required for the High Court and its benches to function effectively.

The district judiciary across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa received a dedicated portion of the budget to support the network of district courts in all the districts of the Province. The allocation

covered salaries for judicial officers and court staff, operational expenses for court activities, and maintenance costs for court buildings. This budget aimed to enable the district judiciary to handle routine casework efficiently, providing the resources required for the continuous operation of local courts across the province.

In summary, the 2023 budget allocation for the judiciary in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa was distributed strategically across different judicial tiers to meet their respective operational and administrative requirements. The Peshawar High Court and its regional benches were allocated a total of 2.401 Billion Rupees, ensuring adequate resources for appellate-level cases and judicial administration at the provincial level. The district judiciary received an allocation of 8.61 Billion Rupees, aimed at supporting the infrastructure and daily functions of courts handling civil and criminal cases across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Altogether, the **gross allocation for the judiciary in the province amounted to 11.01 Billion Rupees**, reflecting a focused investment in judicial infrastructure and service delivery for 2023.

### 5.11 Sanctioned and Working Strength of Officers and Officials in the Peshawar High Court as on 31.12.2023

The table below presents a comprehensive breakdown of the human resource allocation for the Peshawar High Court. With a total of 869 sanctioned positions, 774 are currently filled, leaving 89 vacancies. This allocation spans a range of designations, reflecting the court's layered administrative and operational framework.

Positions at the senior administrative level, including the Chief Justice, Judges, Registrar, and various directors, are largely filled, ensuring stability in the court's leadership. There are, however, three vacancies in the Judge category, which, if addressed, could reduce the workload on existing judges and potentially improve case disposal rates.

The roles related to information technology, such as Programmers, Network Administrators, and Database Administrators, are mostly filled, signifying the court's commitment to technological advancement. However, a few vacancies remain, particularly in programmer positions, which could impact the efficiency of digital case management and data handling.

There are significant vacancies within support staff roles, especially among Junior Clerks (10 vacant), Naib Qasid (17 vacant), and Stenographers (10 vacant). These gaps in support staff could affect daily administrative functions, potentially delaying routine processes and documentation. Additionally, vacancies in positions like CCTV Camera Operators and Security personnel point to potential vulnerabilities in the court's security and monitoring framework.

The 89 vacancies, while constituting a smaller proportion of the total workforce, are strategically impactful. Vacancies in critical support and technical roles may put additional strain on existing staff, potentially leading to burnout and affecting morale. Positions like Assistant, Senior Scale Stenographer, and Junior Clerk, which have higher vacancy rates, are essential for efficient court operations and case processing. Filling these roles would likely enhance workflow continuity and improve overall court functionality.

- District and Sessions Judges:** There are 35 sanctioned posts for District and Sessions Judges, with 31 male and 3 female judges actively working in-field. Additionally, 56 male and 19 female officers are assigned to Ex-cadre positions, with only 1 position currently vacant. This low vacancy rate suggests stability in the highest judicial positions and a balanced distribution of male and female officers in both cadre categories.
- Additional District and Sessions Judges:** Of the 159 sanctioned posts, 116 male and 17 female judges are actively serving in the field, with 2 male officers assigned to Ex-cadre roles. The table reveals 26 vacant positions, indicating a need for further appointments to fill these gaps, which would enhance the court's capacity to handle an increasing workload.
- Senior Civil Judges:** Out of 82 sanctioned posts, 62 male and 20 female Senior Civil Judges are working in the field, while 2 male officers hold Ex-cadre positions. All sanctioned positions are filled, indicating an effective allocation at this level, contributing to operational efficiency across the province's civil courts.
- Civil Judges / Judicial Magistrates / Family Judges:** This category, with 383 sanctioned posts, includes the highest number of judicial officers. Currently, 183 male and 88 female judges are actively working in the field, while 1 male and 1 female judge hold Ex-cadre positions. With 112 vacancies, this segment has the most significant need for recruitment to maintain prompt case processing and minimize delays.

In total, 659 Judicial Officer positions are sanctioned in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, with 392 male and 128 female officers currently working in the field. There are 61 male and 21 female officers in Ex-cadre roles, while 139 positions remain vacant. The vacancies are most

pronounced in the Civil Judge / Judicial Magistrate / Family Judge category, underscoring a pressing need for focused recruitment efforts in lower-tier judicial positions.



It reflects the caseload progression from the start to the end of the year, highlighting new case institutions, transfers, disposals, and the remaining balance.

- Criminal Cases:** As of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, there was a pending caseload of **98,968** criminal cases. Throughout the year, an additional **371,923** cases were instituted, reflecting the significant demand on the criminal justice system. A total of **29,342** cases were transferred in, while **25,302** cases were transferred out, resulting in a net increase in cases processed within the system. With **369,200** cases disposed of during the year, the remaining balance at the end of December 2023 was **105,731**. This shows effective case disposal efforts, yet the high inflow of new cases continues to challenge resources.
- Civil Cases:** Civil cases, including appeals, began the year with a pending load of **164,671** cases. During the year, **168,811** new cases were instituted, with **33,985** transferred in and **32,210** transferred out. The disposal of **163,324** cases brought the pending balance to **171,933** by year-end. The relatively lower disposal rate in civil cases compared to criminal cases suggests that additional resources or procedural improvements may be needed to keep pace with the ongoing case influx.



Combining both categories, the total pending balance increased from **263,639** at the start of the year to **277,664** at year-end, marking a **5.3% overall increase** in pending cases. A total of **540,734** cases were instituted during the year, while **532,524** were disposed.

Overall, the high disposal rates reflect the District judiciary's commitment to managing cases efficiently. However, the slight increase in pending cases indicates the need for continued efforts to keep pace with the high volume of new cases each year. 139 judicial positions are currently vacant out of 659 sanctioned posts in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Filling these positions is crucial to reducing the backlog. Recruitment and deployment of additional judges can

significantly enhance the judiciary's capacity to process cases more swiftly, helping to manage the increasing inflow of new cases and alleviate the existing backlog. Prioritizing the filling of these vacancies will be an essential step toward ensuring timely justice and maintaining an efficient case management system.



- In the **Criminal Jurisdiction**, there are **105,731** pending cases. A detailed analysis reveals that a substantial number of these cases have been instituted in recent years. While the backlog from years prior to **2015** is relatively minor accounting for only **0.01%** of the total cases there has been a dramatic increase in pending cases from **2018** onward. An overwhelming **55.6%** of the total criminal cases were filed during the Year **2023** are still pending in the system.
- Similarly, the **Civil Jurisdiction** shows a backlog of **171,933** pending cases, with a similar trend observed. The percentage of pending cases from the Year **2023** alone represents **49.28%** of the total civil cases, demonstrating the increasing demand for judicial resources and the need for streamlined processes to manage these cases

effectively. Earlier years contribute less significantly to the backlog, with cases from 2014 and earlier accounting for just 1.25% of the total.

## 6 High Court of Balochistan



Prior to the establishment of the High Court of West Pakistan on October 14<sup>th</sup>, 1955, Balochistan was served by a Judicial Commissioner. After the High Court's dissolution on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 1970, a joint High Court for Sindh and Balochistan was created, which operated until November 30, 1976, when separate High Courts were formed for each Province. The High Court of Balochistan was officially established on December 1, 1976.

The High Court of Balochistan has a total sanctioned strength of **11 judges**, including the Chief Justice, all of whom are appointed by the President of Pakistan under Article 175-A of the Constitution. The principal seat is located in Quetta, with a bench in Sibi.

In terms of jurisdiction, the High Court has both appellate and original jurisdiction. It hears appeals against decisions from civil and criminal courts and has the authority to issue writs, including Habeas Corpus, Mandamus, Prohibition, Certiorari, and Quo Warranto.



The table above presents data on case pendency, new case institution, disposals, and the resultant balance for different benches of the High Court of Balochistan during the Year 2023.

- At the **Principal Seat at Quetta**, the initial pendency was **3,727** cases. By the end of the period, the balance increased to **4,238** cases, representing a **13.7% increase in pendency**. This rise, despite a high disposal rate, suggests that the volume of new cases was significant enough to slightly outpace disposals, underscoring a need for further resource allocation or process improvements.
- The **Circuit Bench at Sibi** maintained a relatively stable caseload. It began with **446** cases and ended with **449**, showing a **minor increase in pendency of only 0.7%**. This minimal change indicates effective case management, with the disposal rate nearly matching the rate of new cases, allowing the bench to maintain control over its backlog.
- Conversely, the **Circuit Bench at Turbat** achieved a reduction in its caseload. Starting with **299** pending cases, the bench concluded with **265** cases, reflecting an **11.4% decrease in pendency**. This improvement suggests that the bench was able to handle more cases than it received, leading to a reduced backlog and potentially indicating a well-functioning Case Management System or a lighter caseload.



Across all benches, the total number of cases pending at the start was **4,472**, with **6,920** new cases instituted. Out of these, **6,440** cases were disposed of, leading to an approximate 10% increase in pendency and an ending balance of **4,952** cases.




From 2014 to 2023, the judicial system experienced more or less consistent trends in the number of pending, instituted, and disposed cases. A gradual increase has been noticed in the number of cases instituted and proportionally, the High Court has evenly increased the disposal. There were **4923** cases reported at the start of the Year 2014 and **4952** cases at the end of the Year 2023.

- The number of new cases filed (instituted) steadily increased over the years, with a noticeable uptick from 2018 onward, peaking at **6988 cases** in **2022**, indicating a growing influx of cases into the system.
- While the number of cases disposed of also increased, it fluctuated year-to-year, with **disposals** consistently falling short of institutions, leading to a persistent rise in the backlog of pending cases.



While the number of cases pending at the end of the year showed an overall increase for most of the period, there was a slight **decrease** from **5279** cases in 2014 to **4952** in 2023. This drop indicates a modest improvement in clearing the backlog in recent years, likely due to higher disposal rates, even though new cases continued to be filed at a high pace. Despite this reduction, the backlog remained substantial, suggesting that the system may have made incremental progress but still faces challenges with case load management.



## 6.12 Budget Allocation for the Year 2022-23

The total judicial budget amounts to **5.24 billion PKR**, divided between the High Court and District Judiciary. The **High Court** receives approximately **1.75 billion PKR** (33.3% of the total), while the **District Judiciary** is allocated the larger share of **3.5 billion PKR** (66.7%), reflecting the expansive responsibilities and caseloads managed at the district level

Within the High Court, the Principal Seat in Quetta dominates the budget with a significant allocation of 1.57 billion PKR, constituting almost 90% of the High Court's total budget. The Sibi Bench and Turbat Bench receive comparatively modest shares of 93 million PKR (5.3%) and 82.5 million PKR (4.7%), respectively, highlighting the disparity in resource distribution among the High Court's divisions.

In the District Judiciary, the budget is divided between Session Courts and Civil Courts, with Civil Courts receiving a larger allocation of 2.04 billion PKR (58.3%), compared to 1.46 billion PKR (41.7%) for Session Courts.

Overall, the budget demonstrates a prioritization of resources for the District Judiciary, which manages a substantial portion of the judicial system's workload, and a concentration of funds within the Principal Seat of the High Court, underscoring its pivotal role.

- The sanctioned strength for judicial positions across various categories totals 312, out of which 223 positions are currently filled, leaving 89 positions vacant, amounting to a vacancy rate of 28.5%. The working strength includes 208 in-field judges (183 male and 25 female) and 15 Ex-cadre judges (13 male and 2 female). Despite the overall staffing, there is a significant shortfall, particularly in certain key roles, and a notable gender disparity in representation.
- Among the District & Sessions Judges, 51 positions are sanctioned, with 30 male Judges working in-field and 8 Ex-cadre appointments, leaving 13 positions vacant (25.5% vacancy rate). Similarly, for Additional District & Sessions Judges, 48 positions are sanctioned, with 34 judges working (31 male and 3 female) and 12 vacancies, reflecting a 25% shortfall.
- The Senior Civil Judges cadre shows relatively fewer vacancies, with 20 sanctioned positions and 16 Judges working (15 male, 1 male Ex-cadre), leaving 4 positions vacant (20% vacancy rate). However, this category has no female representation.
- The Judicial Magistrates/Family Judges cadre, which has the highest sanctioned strength of 148, also faces the greatest shortfall, with 73 male and 20 female Judges in-field, supplemented by 3 Ex-cadre appointments, leaving 52 positions vacant (35% vacancy rate). While this category has better female representation compared to others, gender imbalance remains pronounced.
- For Members Majlis-e-Shoora, 21 positions are sanctioned, with 18 Judges working (17 male and 1 female) and 3 positions Vacant (14% vacancy rate), showing better staffing levels than other categories but still limited female representation.
- Similarly, the Qazi cadre, with 24 sanctioned positions, has 19 Judges working (17 male and 1 female in-field, and 1 Ex-cadre female), leaving 5 positions vacant, resulting in a 20.8% shortfall.

Overall, the gender imbalance across all judicial positions is stark, with women making up only 12.1% of the total working strength. While male judges occupy 196 Positions (87.9%), only 27 positions (12.1%) are held by female Judges, with negligible representation in senior roles like District & Sessions Judges and Senior Civil Judges.

The judicial system in Balochistan has faced a challenging yet productive Year in 2023, with both criminal and civil cases seeing significant activity. As the district judiciary continues to navigate a growing caseload, the following analysis reviews the institution, disposal, and pendency of criminal and civil cases within the Province, based on data from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, and December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

- Criminal Cases:** At the start of 2023, the district judiciary of Balochistan had **7,073** criminal cases pending across its courts. Throughout the year, the judiciary saw a substantial influx of **39,846** new criminal cases being filed. This surge reflects the ongoing legal challenges within the region, particularly in the criminal justice sector, which includes a wide range of offenses from minor violations to serious criminal charges. The courts in Balochistan were able to make significant progress in clearing the backlog of criminal cases, disposing of **38,987** cases during the Year. Despite this high disposal rate, the number of pending criminal cases at the end of the Year increased slightly to **7,932**.
- Civil Cases:** The year began with **8,947** civil cases pending before the courts. Like criminal cases, the civil courts also experienced a substantial influx, with **19,695** new cases being filed during the year. **18,756** civil cases were decided by the end of the year. However, despite this significant number of cases being resolved, the number of pending civil cases at year-end increased slightly to **9,886**.



When examining the combined data for criminal and civil cases in the district judiciary of Balochistan, the total pendency at the start of 2023 was **16,020** cases. Throughout the year, a total of **59,541** new cases were filed, reflecting the ongoing demand on the judicial system. By the end of 2023, the judiciary had disposed of **57,743** cases, leaving a total of **17,818** cases pending.

## 7 Islamabad High Court



Under the Capital of the Republic (Determination of Area) Ordinance, 1963 as required by clause (2) of Article 211 of the Constitution 1962, the area of Islamabad Capital Territory was determined.

By virtue of President's Order No.1 of 1970, the Province of West Pakistan was dissolved and in its place the four Provinces Balochistan, North-West Frontier Province/Khyber Pakhtunkawa, Punjab and Sindh were constituted besides two centrally administered areas, namely, the Islamabad Capital Territory and FATA. In clause (2) of Article 14 of this Order the Islamabad Capital Territory was placed within the jurisdiction of the High Court of Punjab. Even President's Order No.8 of 1970 (High Courts Establishment Order 1970) established a High Court for the Province of Punjab and the Islamabad Capital Territory to be called the Lahore High Court Lahore with its principal seat at Lahore.

The Article 1(2)(b) of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan, 1973 declared status of Islamabad Capital Territory as of a distinct territory not forming part of any province. Article 175 of the Constitution provided that there shall be a Supreme Court of Pakistan, a High Court for each Province and such other courts as may be established by law.

Although Islamabad Capital Territory had not been part of any Province of Pakistan yet no independent High Court was established to cater for the litigation pertaining to its area, rather the previous arrangement as made vide Article 3(b) of President's Order No.8 of 1970 (High

Courts Establishment Order 1970) continued. The Article 192(4) of the Constitution had provided about extension of jurisdiction of any High Court to any area in Pakistan not forming part of the Province and in this way the Islamabad Capital Territory remained under jurisdiction of Lahore High Court, Lahore.

By virtue of P.O. No.18 of 1980 followed by S.R.No.1316 (1)/80 dated 31.12.1980, the Islamabad Capital Territory attained Provincial status for the purpose of its governance on administrative side but it remained without its own High Court. As a result of the Islamabad High Court (Establishment) Order 2007, a High Court for Islamabad Capital Territory was established but its cessation took place as a result of the verdict of august Supreme Court of Pakistan reported as **PLD 2009 SC 879**. Thereafter, the Islamabad High Court was established through Islamabad High Court Act 2010 (Act No.XVII of 2010) for Islamabad Capital Territory having original, appellate, provisional and other jurisdictions, as under the Constitution or other laws and also brought all Civil, Criminal, Revenue, Special Courts and Tribunals functioning in the Islamabad Capital Territory under the superintendence and control of the Lahore High Court, Lahore, under the supervision and control of the Islamabad High Court.

### **7.1 Composition of the Court and Appointment of Judges**

Total sanctioned strength of Hon'ble Judges of the Islamabad High Court including the Hon'ble Chief Justice is 7 Judges. They are appointed by the President of Pakistan in accordance with Article 175-A of the Constitution.

### **7.2 Original Pecuniary Jurisdiction of the Court**

Under Section 4 of the Islamabad High Court Act, 2010 the Pecuniary Jurisdiction of Islamabad High Court in respect of Islamabad Capital Territory was originally Rs. 10 Million and any suit or proceeding having pecuniary value of 10 Million Rupees or more could be filed in the Islamabad High Court. However, this limit has been further enhanced since January, 2012 to Rs. 100 Million vide the Islamabad High Court (Amendment) Act, 2011 (Act No. II of 2012).


- Disciplinary actions under Efficiency and Discipline (E&D) Rules were actively pursued. A total of 9 major Penalties were imposed, including 3 dismissals from service, 2 removals from service, 1 compulsory retirement, and 1 reduction to a lower post, primarily affecting district judiciary staff. Additionally, 26 minor penalties were issued, including 18 censures/warnings, 6 stoppages of increments, and 2 cases of withheld promotions.
- Administrative actions were also taken to address complaints, with 65 cases of interventions, including 48 transfers (primarily judicial officers), 3 suspensions, and 14 other actions focused on judicial officers.
- This data underscores the judiciary’s proactive approach to addressing internal complaints while maintaining institutional discipline. However, the significant number of unresolved complaints under “others” and persistent issues like misconduct highlight the need for further categorization, improved complaint resolution mechanisms, and preventive measures to ensure institutional integrity.

- The Islamabad High Court's Principal Seat exhibited significant judicial activity in 2023, reflecting both its commitment to delivering justice and the challenges posed by an increasing caseload. At the beginning of the year, the court had a pending caseload of 17,104 cases. During the year, 10,817 new cases were instituted, while 10,623 cases were successfully disposed of. By the end of the year, the pending caseload stood at 17,298 cases, marking a net increase of 194 cases.
- This data highlights a commendable disposal rate, where approximately 98.2% of the newly instituted cases were resolved within the year. However, the slight increase in the pending caseload underscores the need for continuous efforts to manage and reduce the backlog.
- The increase in pending cases, though marginal, suggests the necessity for targeted strategies, such as prioritizing older cases or exploring Alternative Dispute Resolution mechanisms to enhance efficiency further. Additionally, leveraging technology for case management could streamline processes and support the court in addressing its workload effectively.

The Islamabad High Court's performance reflects its resilience and dedication to upholding justice, while also emphasizing the importance of strategic measures to manage the growing demands on the judicial system.



As of the end of 2023, the Islamabad High Court had **17,298 pending cases**, distributed as follows:

- **Criminal Jurisdiction:** 1,194 cases (6.9% of the total).
- **Civil Jurisdiction:** 5,904 cases (34.1% of the total).
- **Writ Jurisdiction:** 10,200 cases (59% of the total).

**Older Cases (up to 2014):**

- A total of **489 cases** (2.8%) are pending from 2014 or earlier, showing that a small but notable backlog of older cases still exists.
- These older cases are concentrated primarily in civil jurisdiction (**308 cases**) and writ jurisdiction (**170 cases**).

**Recent Cases (2021–2023):**

- **11,406 cases (65.9%)** were instituted between 2021 and 2023, highlighting a significant increase in recent filings.


### 7.10 Consolidated Pendency, Institution, Disposal and Balance of Cases in the Islamabad High Court, Islamabad during the Last 10 Years

Over the past decade (2014–2023), the Islamabad High Court has seen notable trends in the institution and disposal of cases, impacting the pendency of cases. A total of **87,212 cases** were instituted, while **85,052 cases** were disposed of, resulting in a net increase of **2,160 pending cases** during this period. The number of pending cases rose from **13,110 in 2014** to **17,298 in 2023**, reflecting a steady growth in the caseload.



The yearly trends reveal that case institutions surpassed disposals in six out of ten years (2014, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2021, and 2023). In these years, the higher number of new filings contributed to an increased backlog. Particularly in **2017**, a significant gap between institutions (**8,373**) and disposals (**6,721**) led to a steep rise in pending cases, reaching **16,276** by the end of the year.

In contrast, there were four years (2015, 2019, 2020, and 2022) where the disposal rate exceeded or closely matched institutions, demonstrating improved judicial efficiency. For instance, in **2019**, disposals (**9,971**) outpaced institutions (**8,782**), reducing the pending caseload from **17,074 to 15,885**. Similarly, **2022** was a standout year, with the highest disposal rate of the decade at **10,364 cases**, slightly reducing the backlog to **17,104**. In **2023**, the institution rate rose to **10,817**, closely matched by **10,623 disposals**, resulting in a minor increase in pending cases to **17,298**.



The pending caseload grew significantly in the earlier years, rising from **13,110 in 2014** to **16,276 in 2017**, reflecting a consistent imbalance between institutions and disposals. Between **2018 and 2020**, pendency stabilized, fluctuating between **15,885 to 16,288**, thanks to periods of higher disposal rates. However, from **2021 onward**, pending cases began to climb again, reaching **17,298 by 2023**.



The Islamabad High Court has made notable progress in improving its disposal rate in specific years; however, the growing trend in case institutions has outpaced these efforts, leading to an overall increase in pending cases. To address this issue, further enhancements in judicial efficiency, resource allocation, and case management strategies are required to reduce the backlog and maintain a balance between institution and disposal rates.

\* The difference in balance of cases is due to automation and physical verification. The data may vary/differ due to transfer, re-opening/restoration, remand and in case where leave to appeal is granted by the Court or delayed data entry of Institution & Disposal, etc.

The budgetary allocation for the Islamabad High Court (IHC) and the District Judiciary of Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) reflects a strategic approach to ensuring the effective functioning of the judicial system in the region.

- For the Islamabad High Court, a total budget of **1,543,322,000 PKR** has been allocated for the Principal Seat in Islamabad. This allocation is classified as a “Charged” expenditure, meaning it is directly charged to the consolidated fund. It primarily covers the salaries and allowances of judges and staff, as well as operational costs such as utilities and maintenance. Additionally, the budget supports investments in judicial infrastructure and technology to improve the efficiency of court operations.
- The District Judiciary, which includes both the Sessions Courts and Civil Courts for East and West Islamabad, has been allocated a total of **1,261,179,000 PKR**. Of this, **580,401,991 PKR** is allocated to the Sessions Courts (East & West), which covers the administration of criminal justice, the handling of sessions cases, and the maintenance of related court facilities. The remaining **680,777,009 PKR** is dedicated to the Civil Courts (East & West), which are responsible for adjudicating civil disputes. This

funding supports operational costs, the payment of salaries for judicial officers and staff, and the upkeep of court facilities.

- In total, the combined budget allocation for the Islamabad High Court and the District Judiciary for the Year is **2,804,501,000 PKR**. The Islamabad High Court receives **55%** of the total allocation, while the District Judiciary receives **45%**. This distribution ensures a balanced focus on both higher and lower courts, recognizing the critical role both play in the judicial system.

The allocation demonstrates a clear emphasis on operational efficiency, with significant funds dedicated to salaries, daily operations, and infrastructure development. However, while the Islamabad High Court receives a larger portion of the budget, the resources for the District Judiciary are equally crucial to address challenges at the grassroots level, where most cases are initiated.



The 2023 data for Islamabad's District Judiciary reveals a commendable effort in managing the high volume of cases, with a disposal rate closely aligned with the influx of new cases. However, a slight increase in the overall backlog primarily in criminal cases highlights the need for enhanced reforms and resource allocation to effectively manage the growing caseload.

- In the **Criminal Cases** category, there were **19,010 cases pending** at the start of the Year. During 2023, **71,721 new Criminal Cases** were instituted, and **69,344 cases** were disposed of, leaving a balance of **21,387 cases** by the end of the year. This suggests that while the court handled a large number of criminal cases, the volume of new cases added still resulted in a slight increase in pending cases by the end of the year.
- In the **Civil Cases** category, the system started with **32,093 pending cases**. Over the course of 2023, **50,620 new Civil Cases** were filed, and **52,400 cases** were disposed of. This led to a remaining balance of **30,313 Civil Cases**. While the court disposed of more civil cases than were newly instituted, the pending caseload still slightly reduced by the year-end.



Overall, the **grand total** of all Cases (Criminal and Civil) started the Year with **51,103 pending cases**. During 2023, a total of **122,341 cases** were instituted, and **121,744 cases** were disposed of, leaving a **balance of 51,700 cases** at the end of the year. This indicates that despite disposing of a large number of cases, the total pendency slightly increased, suggesting the ongoing challenge of managing the influx of new cases.
