PRESS RELEASE

Mr. Justice Yahya Afridi, the Chief Justice of Pakistan/ Chairman, Law and Justice Commission of Pakistan (LJCP) chaired the 45th meeting of the LJCP held today at the Supreme Court of Pakistan. The Commission reaffirmed its commitment to realizing an accessible and equitable justice system for all citizens, emphasizing the Commission's unwavering dedication to judicial excellence and the establishment of a fair and just society in Pakistan.

The meeting was attended by Chief Justices of the High Courts, Attorney General for Pakistan and Secretary, Ministry of Law and Justice attended as ex-officio members. The meeting was also attended by Mr. Makhdoom Ali Khan, Khawaja Haris Ahmed, Mr. Kamran Murtaza, and Mr. Muhammad Munir Paracha senior Advocates of the Supreme Court of Pakistan.

The Commission reviewed the implementation status of its previous decisions taken in 44th meeting, particularly the progress made by the Advisory Committee for law reforms comprising Secretary, Ministry of Law and Justice and eminent lawyers. The Committee acknowledged the need and significance of reforms in family laws and the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1898. The Commission applauded the commendable job done by the Committee and hoped that in consultation with relevant stakeholders the Committee will suggest viable recommendations for improving the service delivery of justice system with regard to family dispute and criminal matters.

The Commission approved the Annual Accounts of the Access to Justice Development Fund for FY 2024-25.

For institutional development and enhancing the performance of LJCP, the Commission constituted a Committee to review the LJCP Employees Service Rules of 1992 and suggest reforms to enhance administrative efficiency and enable performance management.
